It is my great honor and privilege to once again welcome you to our annual CAPA-CEF Intern Graduation celebration. We are fortunate to have 23 CAPA-CEF Intern graduates tonight, participating in the 25th (Silver anniversary) year of the CAPA-CEF intern program.

As we gather tonight to celebrate this milestone year for CAPA-CEF, we are in the midst of an historic political cycle, with the U.S. Presidential election coming up in a just a little over a year. Candidates for that highest office have gathered from the four corners of our nation. They hail from a wide range of political viewpoints, from the most liberal to the staunchest conservative. More importantly, for purposes of reflecting our great democracy's social and political progress, they hail from every race, gender and creed.
