





AILY ZHANG COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP AWARD

Aily Zhang is an 8th grader at Canyon Middle School in Castro Valley, California. She was born in Tokyo, Japan. In the United States she has lived in many areas, including Texas, Iowa, and New Jersey. Moving around a lot has given Aily a great perspective of the world.

Last summer, her eyes were opened by the suffering of impoverished people in China. She decided to act upon a desire to improve these people's lives and, as the president of her school's CJSF chapter (California Junior Scholarship Federation) decided to join in collaboration with the UN's Millennium Promise organization.

The Millennium Promise's goal is to end extreme global poverty by 2025 through reaching the 8 Millennium Development Goals (MDGs). The MDGs address many of the aspects of poverty- like income poverty, hunger, disease, lack of adequate shelter. It promotes gender equality, education, and environmental sustainability. As of now, Canyon's CJSF has been able to help more than 2,000 people living in impoverished areas since the beginning of the school year!

Through her community service project, in which she promotes youth leadership and involvement in the fight against poverty Aily was awarded as Prudential Spirit of the Community California Middle School State Honoree. The award is given to young people in the U.S. dedicated to trying to make the world a better place.

She hopes to change the world, as it had changed her last summer. After all, "You've got to be the change you want to see in the world." [Mahatma Ghandi]

Gala 2007 Keynote Speaker

Contra Costa County Supervisor Susan Bonilla



Susan A. Bonilla was sworn-in as the Contra Costa County Supervisor for District IV in January 2007. She was previously elected to the Concord City Council in 2002, serving as Vice Mayor in 2005 and Mayor in 2006. In her time on the Concord City Council, she initiated the Literacy Coalition which serves as a network of literacy providers dedicated to raising the awareness of literacy needs and mobilizing volunteers to meet these needs. In 2006, Susan, as Mayor of Concord, was primarily involved in discussions with Department of the Navy regarding the reuse of the Concord Naval Weapons Station.

Susan resides as Chair of Contra Costa County's Internal Operations Committee, which oversees Contra Costa County operations, policies, and procedures. In addition, Susan is a member of Contra Costa

County's Family and Human Services Committee as well as the Contra Costa County State and Federal Legislative Committee. Susan also serves on countywide and regional boards, commissions, and task forces to serve her constituents.

Susan has been a resident of Concord since 1989. Her community participation has included many years with the neighborhood swim team, AYSO soccer, and involvement with parent-faculty clubs. She has worked in various capacities in the Mt. Diablo Unified School District as a teacher in the Gifted and Talented Program, as a teacher of English as a Second Language in the adult program and as an English teacher at Concord High School. She also taught British Literature at Berean Christian High School in Walnut Creek. Susan received a B.A. in English from Azusa Pacific University in 1982 and completed a teaching credential program at California State University at Los Angeles in 1987. She and her husband John have four daughters.

Susan McNulty Rainey was appointed March 18, 1997 to fill a vacancy on the Walnut Creek City Council following the death of Ron Beagley and elected to a four-year term in November 1998. Due to the absence of an election, she was appointed to a second term in November 2002. She was re-elected to her second full term in November 2006. She also served as Mayor in 2001-2002 and is currently Mayor for 2006-07.

As a member of the Moraga Town Council from 1974 to 1980, Mrs. Rainey served as mayor and vice mayor. She also served on the steering committee for the incorporation of the Town of Moraga and was elected to the first Town Council.

A commercial real estate agent from 1981 to 1990, Mrs. Rainey previously worked as a project manager for Perma Bilt Homes and Bedford Properties.

She earned her bachelor's of science degree in nursing at the University of Washington in 1961 and served as a 2nd Lieutenant in the U.S. Army Nurse Corps from 1959 to 1961. Her honors include Mt. Diablo Junior Women's Citizen of the Year (1973), Contra Costa Council Service Award (1990), American Cancer Society Humanitarian of the Year (1991), Wellness Community Volunteer of the Year (1994), and Silver Beaver Award, Boy Scouts of America (1995).

A Walnut Creek resident since 1987, she is married to former state Senator Richard K. Rainey, who is currently regional director for the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).






